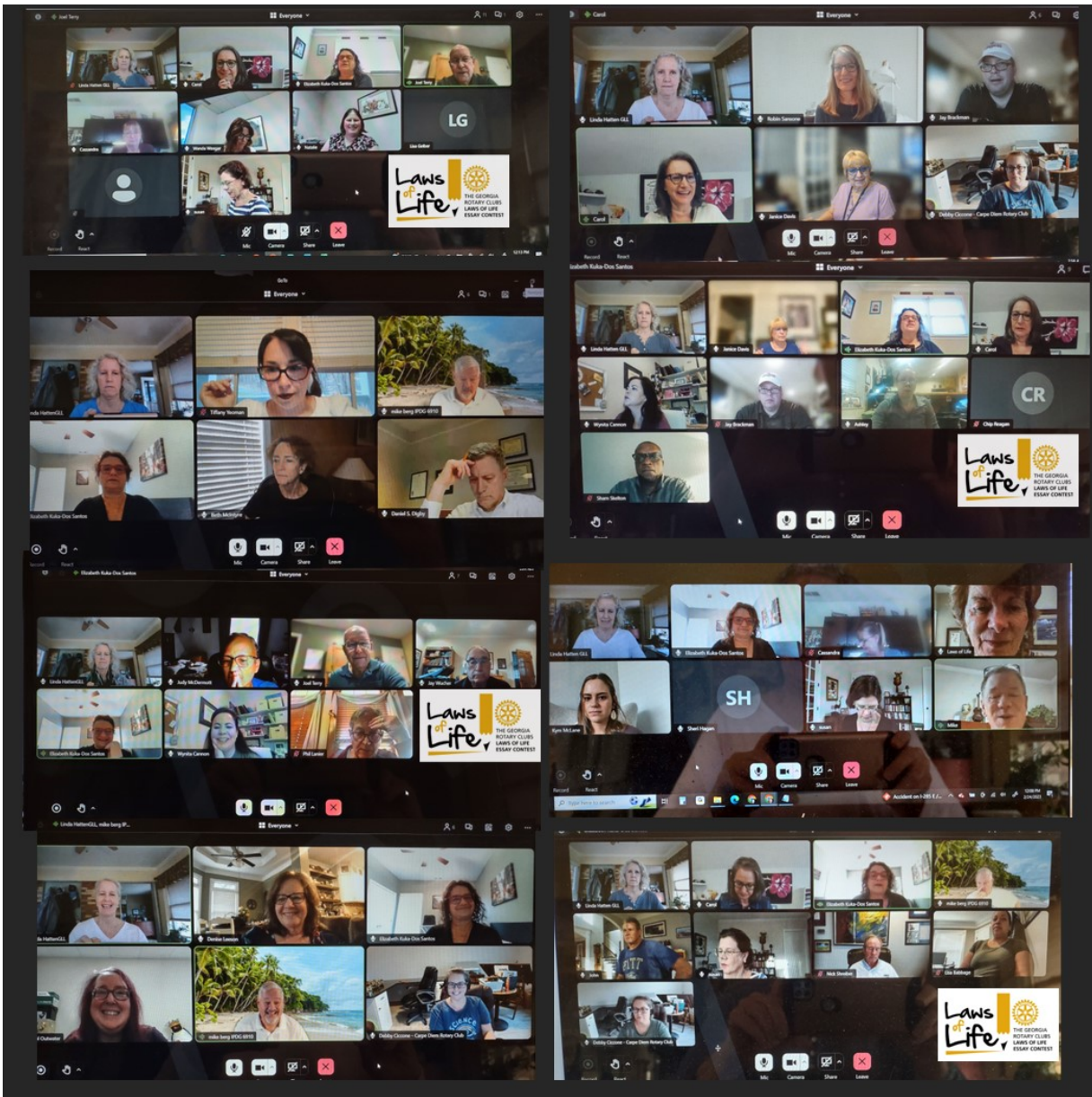
GRSP Update **GRSP Names Trio for Oslo Summer Scholarships**

The recipients of the scholarships must pay their travel expense to and from the airport, plus provide their own personal spending money. [more]
